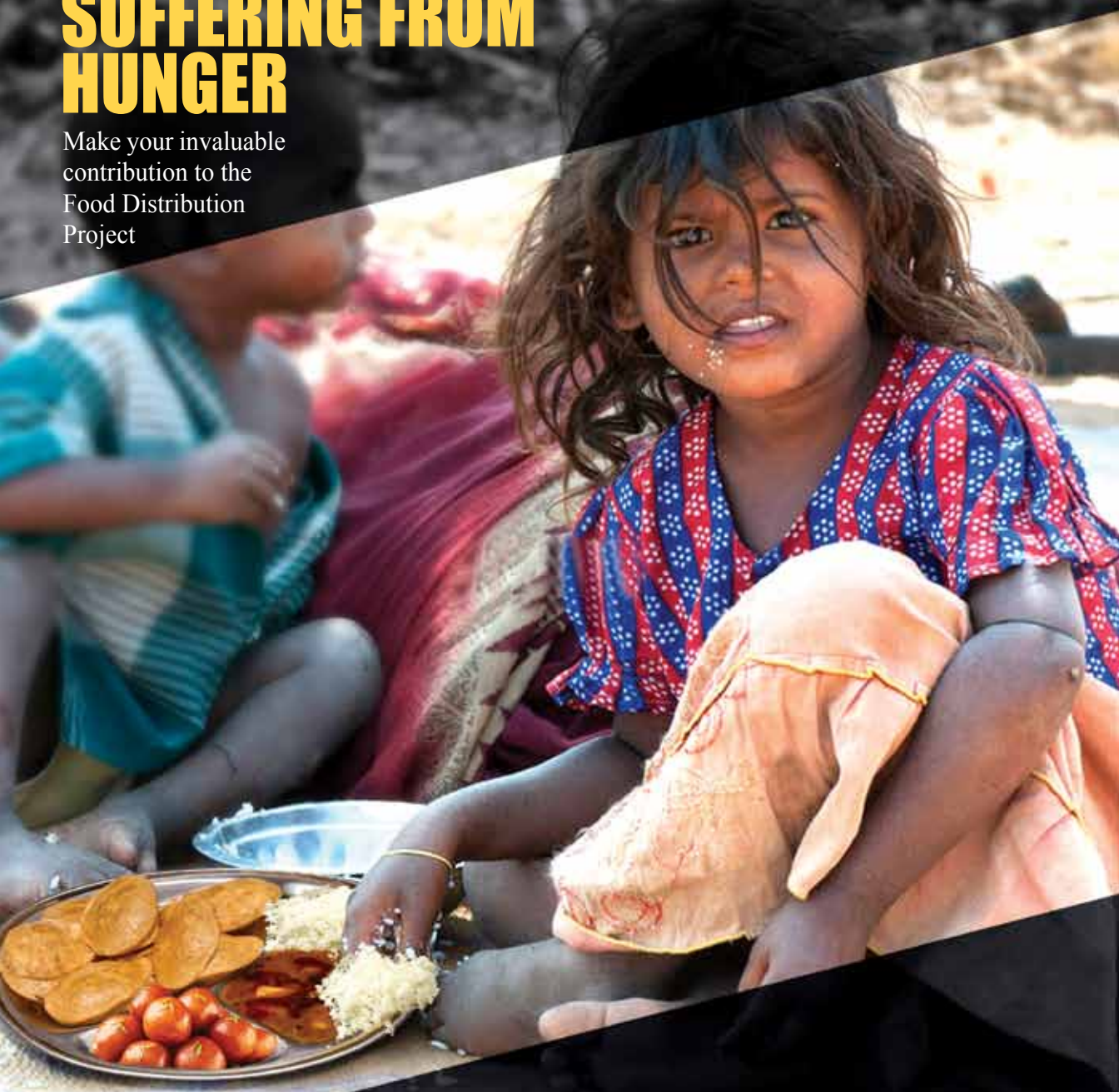

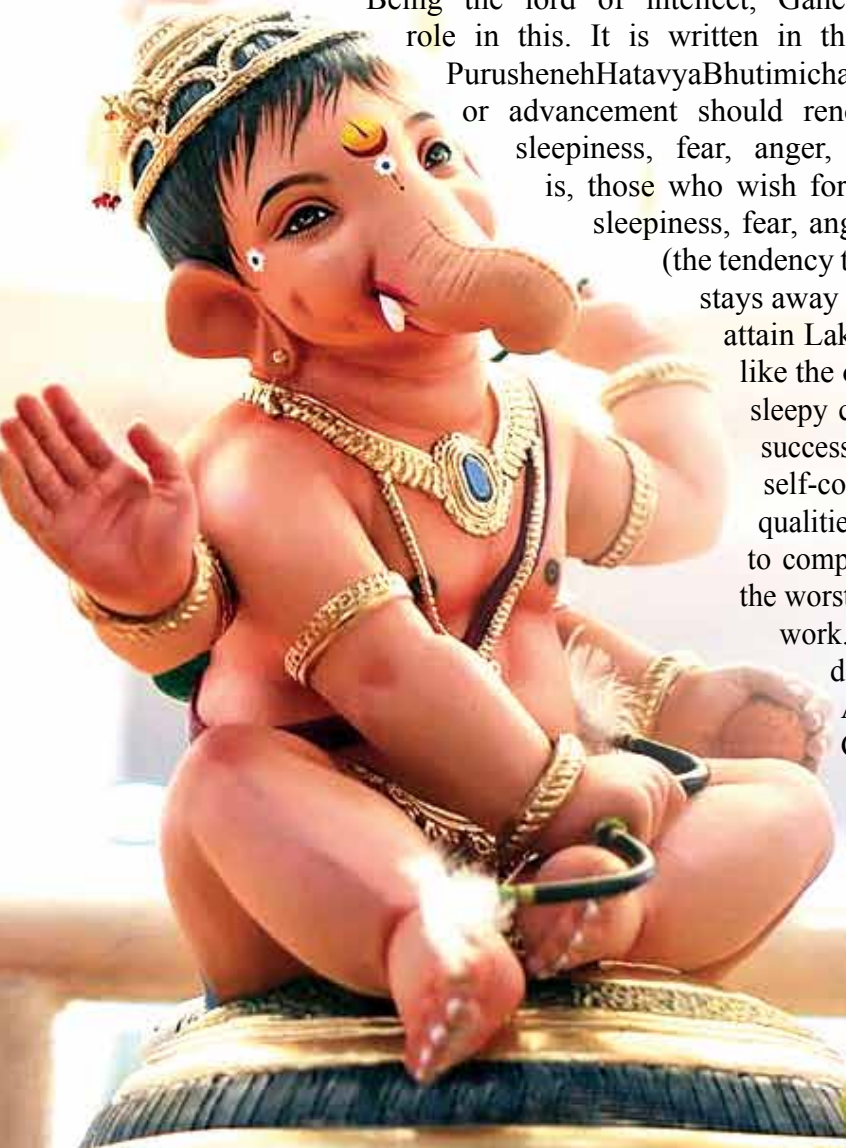

your thoughts and actions. Serve the poor

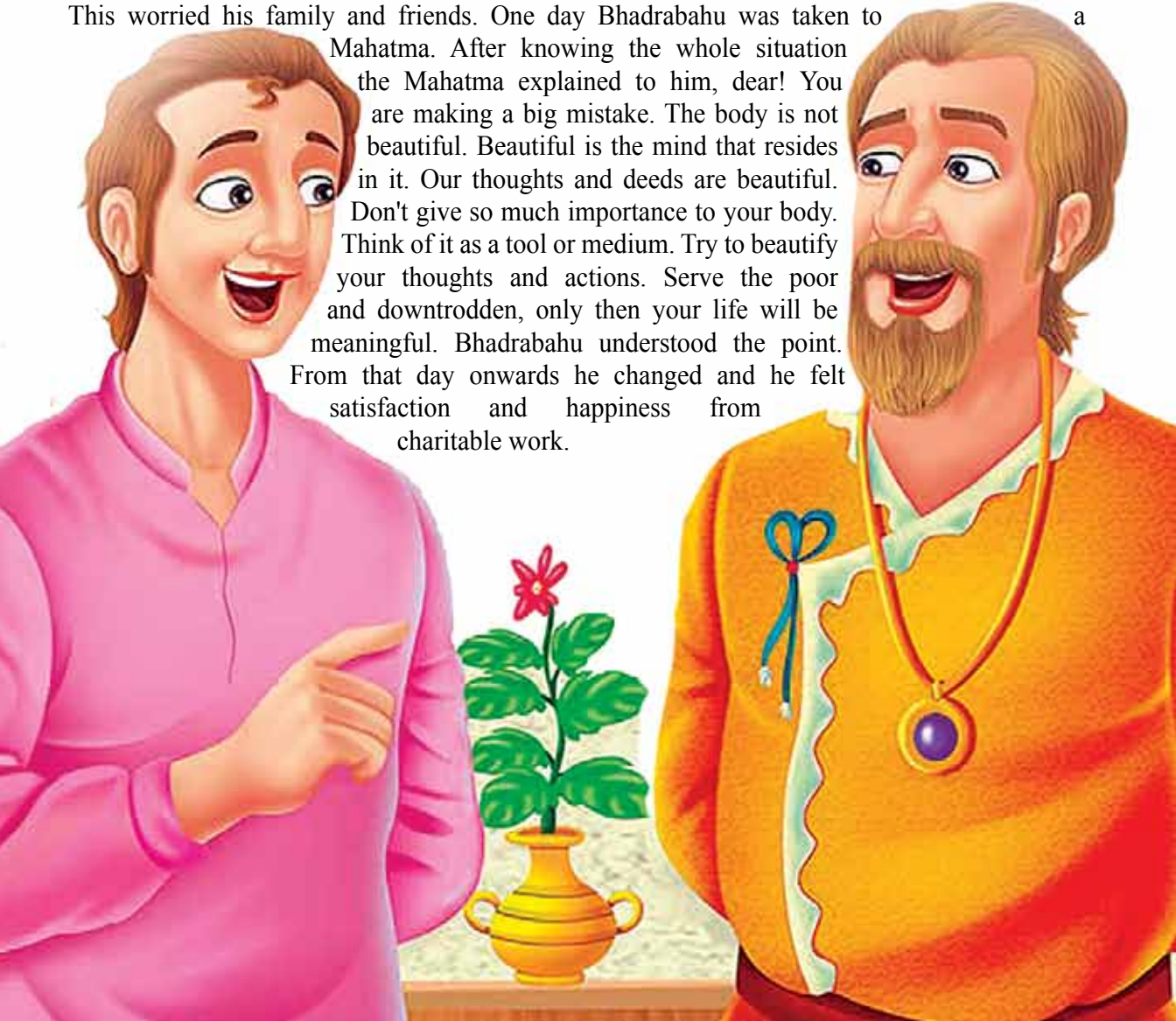
and downtrodden, only then your life will be

## Trisha's treatment went on for two and a half years



### **Congenital deformity will be removed and she will start walking**

Six years ago, a girl child was born to Upendra Yadav (32) as the first child. The arrival of the first child in the house in the form of Lakshmi is considered auspicious. There was a lot of happiness in the family, but when they came to know that the right leg of the new born girl Trisha was adjacent to the knee and the paw was also bent, the family's happiness was replaced by sadness. Upendra does labour and farming work in his hometown of Nalanda (Bihar). Along with doing household chores, wife Pooja helps in farming. Someone said that with age, Trisha's deformity would automatically heal. The parents continued to do compress-massage with warm water, but even by the age of 6, the deformity kept increasing instead of decreasing. Trisha started having trouble getting up and sitting. She was also taken to hospitals for treatment, but the cost of treatment was so much that the family was unable to bear her burden and there was no hope of help from anywhere. During this time, they got information from social media about the free surgery for such deformities by specialist doctors in Narayan Seva Sansthan. Pooja remembered that the treatment of her sister-in-law's differently-abled daughter had also taken place there. In February 2020, the Yadav couple came to the Sansthan located in Udaipur with their daughter, where after five days the first operation on the foot took place. Then a month later, on March 30, the plaster was cut and she was looked after for a few days. For two-and-a-half years, they had to visit the Sansthan for treatment. Everything like accommodation, food, medicine, etc. was better and free. Trisha's foot was also improving now. Recently, on June 11, 2022, a special ring has been put on the feet of the daughter. Now she gets up and walks, the eyes of the parents moist with happiness. They thank the Sansthan time and again.

In collaboration with Bhartiya Adhikar Sansthan Trust Prithvipur-Niwari (M.P.), the artificial limb distribution camp of the Sansthan was organized on 5th June in the Krishi Upaj Mandi Complex, Prithvipura. In which 19 brothers and sisters who lost their hands and feet in accidents were provided artificial limbs according to their measurements. The sound of moaning kept coming, it was as if a child was moaning. The darkness was deep, Kailash proceeded from where the sound was coming, then outside the hospital, in a dark corner, the young man was moaning and sobbing. Kailash went to him. He was 18-20 years old. Kailash asked what had happened to him and who left him there, he started crying instead of answering. Kailash felt as if God was testing him, he looked around but did not see anyone, so he courageously picked up the boy himself and with great difficulty somehow took the young man inside the hospital. Seeing the condition of the boy, the doctor immediately admitted him. The boy's hands and feet had turned black. The doctor, on seeing him, told him that he was struck by an electric current. It was as if electric wires had fallen on his body or he had fallen on electric wires. The doctor guessed that the boy must have gone to graze the goats where such an incident happened to him and some villager brought him and threw him outside the hospital. Kailash started thinking that whoever left the boy outside the hospital could have left him inside too, but everyone is afraid of the police. Kailash himself had seen the behaviour of the police in Pindwada.

After examining the boy thoroughly, the doctor told Kailash that both the arms and legs of the boy would have to be amputated, there was Gangrene which had every possibility of spreading to other parts of the body as well. Kailash was stunned to hear the doctor, he had full faith in the doctor, and he was a respected surgeon in the area. If he is saying something, then he must be saying it thoughtfully. Seeing Kailash contemplating, the doctor said again - take a quick decision, if the hands and feet are not cut off immediately, the boy's life will not be saved. Kailash was confused. He had brought an unknown young man found on the road to the hospital to help. It was a coincidence that Kailash left the house at that time or else he would have fallen asleep at home. When Kailash told the doctor about the inner struggle, the doctor said that maybe God must have woken Kailash up while sleeping so that he can come to this boy and save him. This statement from the doctor helped Kailash to take a decision, he started thinking that if the boy's arms and legs are not cut off, he will die, if he cuts off his hands and feet, at least his life will be saved. Kailash decided and told the doctor that he should do the operation.

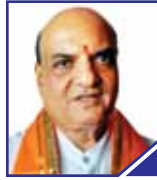

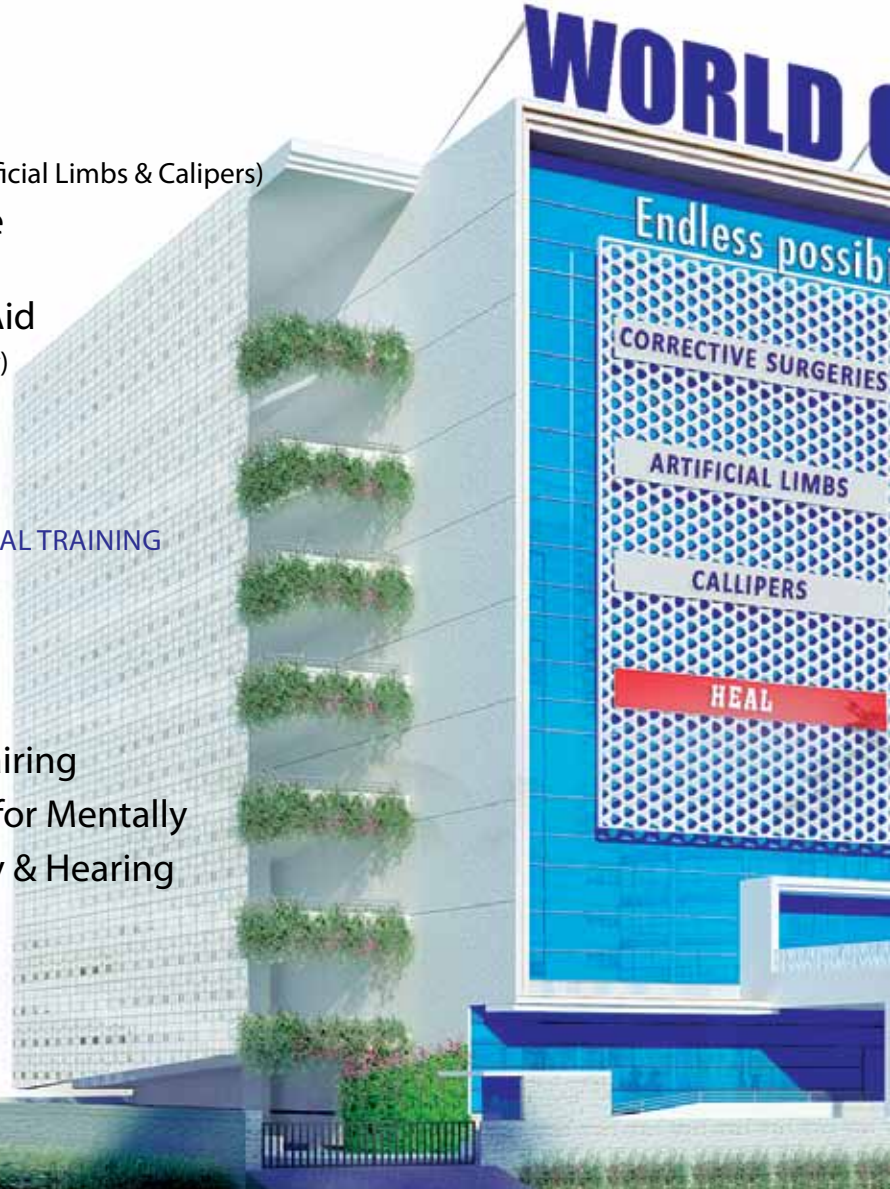

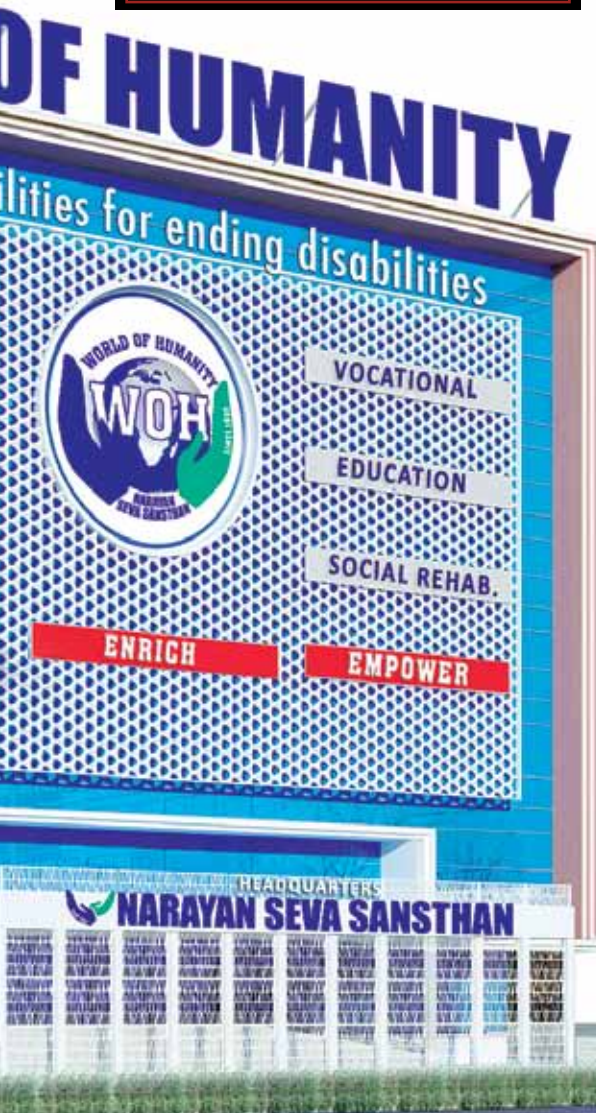
