# The Wave of Happiness in the Life of the Bhoomi

**B**hoomi, residing in Neem Ka Thana, Rajasthan, was born with her left foot about 10 inches smaller than her right foot. This not only caused difficulties in standing, sitting, and walking but also raised concerns about the possibility of deformity in the knee of the other foot. Bhoomi's grandfather, Sheshram Yadav, shares that the family was overjoyed at the birth of their daughter, but this joy did not last. When it was discovered that the daughter had a smaller foot from birth, a significant sorrow befell the family. However, in the face of destiny, what could they do? Tears flowed as they devoted themselves to raising their daughter. Medical treatment was not



possible. In the midst of this, they learned about the 'Free Artificial Limb Distribution and Polio Corrective Surgeries Selection Camp' by Narayan Seva Sansthan. This brought a glimmer of hope. Without wasting any time, on November 5, 2023, Bhoomi's grandparents brought her to the Sansthan in Udaipur after gathering relevant information. The Sansthan's specialized team of doctors measured the foot and, on November 9, provided Bhoomi with a high-quality Narayan Limb. Additionally, they conducted exercises to practice walking. After this, Bhoomi can now stand comfortably without any support and walk on her own feet. The family is delighted to see their daughter walking and playing without assistance. They express immense gratitude to the Sansthan, stating that it has dispelled the darkness and illuminated their daughter's future.



# Sanju's liberation from the chains of a dragging life

**B** Sanju, a resident of Mandsaur, Madhya Pradesh, achieved liberation from the constraints of a challenging life at the age of twenty-two. At just 1-year-old polio struck abruptly, not only robbing her of the joys of childhood but also depriving her of the ability to walk and move independently as she grew older. Sanju faced the harsh reality of navigating life on the ground, restricted to crawling and dragging herself. Her parents spared no effort in seeking every possible treatment, but satisfaction and relief seemed elusive. Meanwhile, the anguish of seeing their daughter's pain and contemplating her future weighed heavily on their hearts. The societal taunts, foreseeing a

Now, Sanju is not only content but also leads a fulfilling life, spending her days navigating the computer with her fingers. The income generated from her newfound skills not only meets her needs but also contributes to the household expenses. The family expressed gratitude, acknowledging that the Sansthan played a pivotal role in making their daughter self-sufficient. They have no words sufficient to convey their appreciation, except to say that the Sansthan has given their entire family a new lease on life.

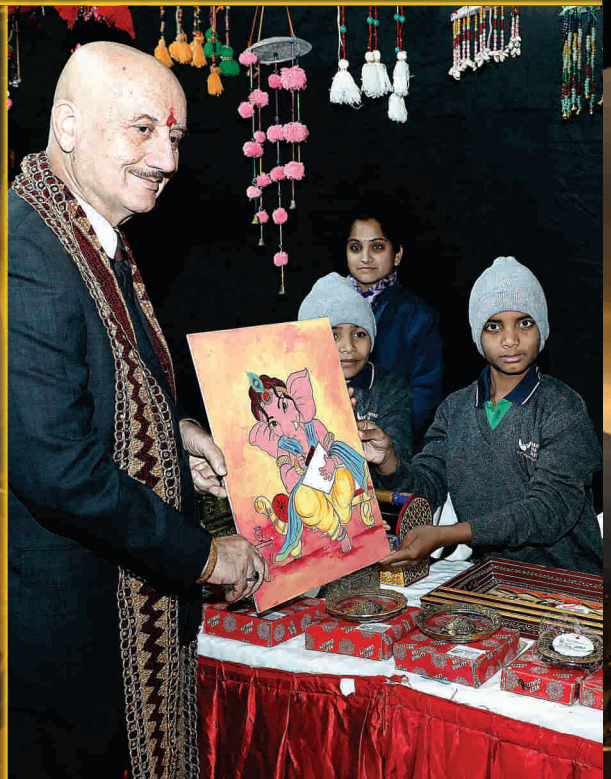
## Anupam Kher Honored Esteemed Service Personnel

## Valsad

A large free Divyang Diagnosis, Artificial limb and Caliper Measurement Camp was organized on December 3, courtesy of Umiya Social Trust, at Shri Saurashtra KadnaPatidar, SevaSamajSeviBhawan, Valsad (Gujarat). The camp witnessed the registration of 126 differently-abled individuals. A team led by P&O Dr. Neha Agnihotri conducted measurements of 85 for making artificial limbs and 17 for making calipers. The chief guest for the event was District Collector Mrs. KshipraAgre. Social Welfare Officer Mr. V.M. Gohil, presided over the event. # Medical and Aid camp in Ukhaliat

**O**n December 18, Sansthan conducted a free medical check-up, medicine distribution, and assistance camp in Ukhaliat, a tribal area of Udaipur district.

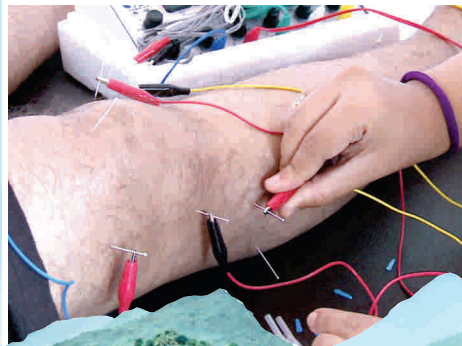
