From struggle to strength, an artificial limb changed everything

his is the agony of a 36-year-old man.

Dinesh Nishad, from Maharajganj, Uttar Pradesh, told in his story that in 2016, after being bitten by a poisonous mosquito, a minor blister appeared on his left leg. Later, it turned into a wound. Over time, his leg began to decay, and during treatment, his left leg had to be amputated to stop the spread. He had to quit working after losing his leg. Some time passed, and he returned to work because no one else to support the family. His miserable condition worsened in the year 2021. Destiny repeated the story & a mosquito-like insect NUMANAN SEVA SANSTHAT attacked him on the other leg. A week later, he experienced a burning sensation in that area. He took it to the doctor in Gorakhpur, where he was informed that it had caused gangrene on his right leg and that the leg would have to be amputated. The whole family sank into mourning, and in the end, he had to lose another leg. After that, every day was a struggle for them until they found out about the free limb distribution camp being held on October 30, 2022, by Narayan Seva Sansthan. Dinesh arrived at the camp, where his measurements were taken for prosthetic limbs. After a month in the next camp, he received artificial limbs as well as training on how to stand, walk, & run with them. He also praised Sansthan for its humanitarian work for Divyangs. He added that he had been unable to stand or walk for nine years but is now back on his feet & cannot express his gratitude to Sansthan enough.







The other colleagues in the office laughed at Kailash's words and said which miser are you taking along. He is not able to spend even a single rupee from his pocket in his office transfer party, what will he do?

Kailash overhears his friend's talkand took him with him. This companion of Kailash often accompanied him to the hospital. Gradually he changed so much that he started going to the hospital alone without Kailash. If a patient needed khichdi, he would get khichdi made from his own home and fed him. Even brought a blanket to a patient and covered him. Everyone was surprised to see such a change in the one whom everyone used to tease as stingy. The result of this was that slowly other people also started taking interest in this service work.

Kailash was very happy seeing all this. Now he has also started keeping some books fromGeeta Press Gorakhpur in his bag. Thin instructional books used to come at very low prices. Kailash bought 10-12 at once and kept them in his bag. He used to give these books to patients to read and if they read them, he would take them back and give them to someone else. Once an old man was given a book, he told his helplessness and said that he is illiterate, he does not know how to read. Kailash took out another book from his bag and gave it to the old man.Sita Ram, Sita Ram was written in this entire book. Along with this, Kailash also gave him a pencil and explained to him that Sita-Ram is written in the whole book. Keeping this pencil on every word, you keep saying Sita Ram, in this way you will read the whole book. The next day when Kailash went back to that old man he was looking very happy. Seeing Kailash with great enthusiasm, he told that despite being illiterate, he enjoyed reading the book so much that he kept saying Sita-Ram, Sita-Ram while reading the book till two in the night. Seeing the enthusiasm of the old man, Kailash suddenly remembered an incident from his childhood. Continued...
