

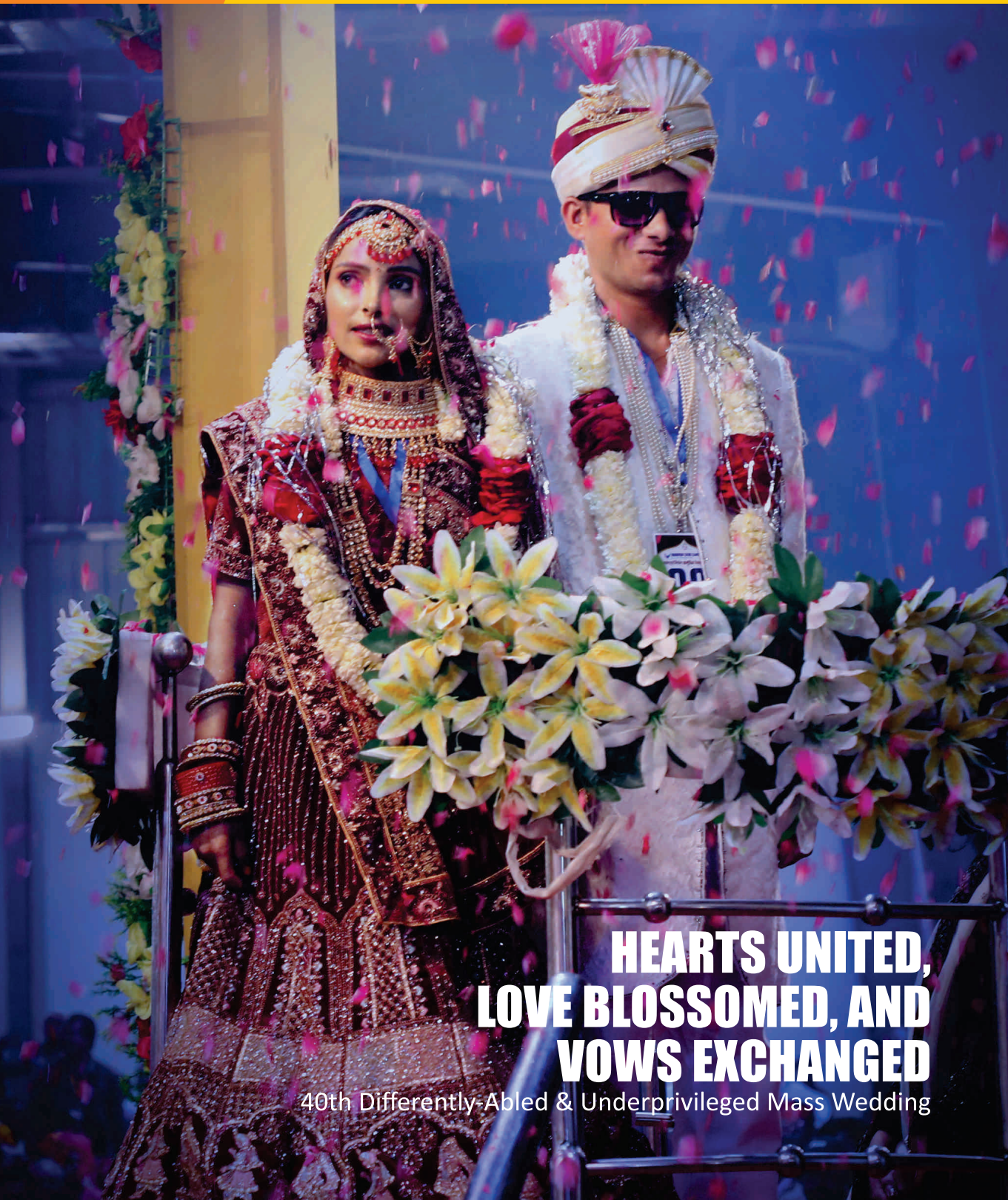

Morale Boosted with an Artificial Leg

A dreadful road accident catapulted Anil's life into the uncertainty of fate. Faced with such a dire situation at a young age, it seemed as if his future had been shattered.



Sixteen-year-old Anil Kumar, a resident of Bikaner, was leading a happy life with his family. However, three years ago, a tragic road accident left him severely injured, prompting those around him to admit him to a nearby hospital. During the course of treatment, it became necessary to amputate his left leg.

Having to rely on just one leg to walk and struggling to carry on with a life that was once filled with laughter and playfulness, Anil became increasingly disheartened. Enduring the pain of disability, he felt a sense of hopelessness creeping in. But in May 2023, the news of free artificial limb distribution from Narayan SevaSansthan reached him through social media, reigniting a spark of hope in his life.

On June 27, when Anil arrived at the institution, the specialized orthotic and prosthetic team quickly measured his leg, and within three days, a prosthetic leg was custom-made for him. Anil happily shares that he can now walk comfortably like others and engage in all kinds of activities. He extends his heartfelt gratitude to the sansthan and the generous donors, whose support not only gave him a new life but also provided the support he needed for a brighter future ahead.

An Artificial Leg Filled Riya's Life with Colors of Happiness

IN Sonitpur Assam, a five-year-old girl named Riya Chatterjee was born, bringing a wave of joy to her family. The atmosphere was filled with happiness, as it typically is when new life enters the world. However, this joy quickly transformed into sorrow when it was discovered that the little girl's right foot had been deformed from birth, resembling a lump of flesh with no bone structure.

Riya's mother was devastated when she learned of this condition just three days after her daughter's birth. The news was a heavy blow, and her parents couldn't help but be engulfed by a sense of misfortune. As Riya grew older, her struggles multiplied. Hopping around on a single leg, she would often cry herself to sleep, enduring excruciating pain through the night. She yearned to go to school like any other child but found herself facing not only her physical challenges but also the

taunts and mockery of her peers.

The weight of their daughter's hardships became almost unbearable for her parents. Both were deeply moved, shedding tears in the solitude of their anguish. It was in July 2023 that they discovered a glimmer of hope on social media, as they stumbled upon a video showcasing Narayan SevaSansthan's remarkable work and its renowned free artificial limb program, offering new hope and life-changing solutions to people like Riya.

Without wasting any time, Riya's parents decided to go to Udaipur, where the sansthan is based. There, they met with expert doctors and a dedicated team who carefully examined Riya's foot and worked diligently to craft a specialized artificial leg. After two days of meticulous work, Riya's new limb was ready. Following some practice sessions and walking exercises, Riya was finally able to walk comfortably without any assistance.

The 40th Differently-Abled & Underprivileged Mass Wedding

Dreams are something cherished by all, and when a dream of transforming one's life circumstances and direction into reality becomes tangible, conveying that joy isn't always easy. Such a beautiful and heartfelt dream was held in the eyes of young individuals from differently-abled and economically disadvantaged families. Despite often facing challenging circumstances, this dream found its realization through Narayan SevaSansthan during the grand 40th Mass Wedding Ceremony.

Much like those who cannot stand, walk, or even see without assistance, these couples embarked on their life's journey. However, their companionship has turned their life's journey into a joyous one. With these heartfelt emotions, 54 differently-abled and economically disadvantaged couples began their marital journey, taking the sacred seven vows around the holy fire. As their hearts overflowed with enthusiasm, the burdens of disability and poverty faded into the background.





Amidst the presence of thousands of guests from across the country, along with the couples' relatives, friends, and well-wishers, these moments became even more memorable and emotional as they showered endless love upon these newlyweds. The founder-chairman of the Sansthan, Padma Shri Kailash 'Manav,' along with co-founder Kamala Devi, President Prashant Agarwal, Director Vandana Agarwal, Director Palak Agarwal, Trustees Jagdish Arya, and Devendra Choubisa, joined over 1500 esteemed guests and generous donors who participated in the sacred kanyadaan ritual for the brides, gracing this second Mass Wedding Ceremony of the year with their presence and warmth.





The event commenced with the break of dawn in the early auspicious hours, as the traditional ritual of toran was performed using neem leaves. Following this sacred ritual, amidst a grand pandal, the newlyweds exchanged garlands, and with heartfelt unity, they silently consented to embark on their journey together in wedlock. During this heart-warming ceremony, rose petals rained down upon them, symbolizing blessings. Subsequently, the 54 couples were wedded according to Vedic rituals on 54 beautifully decorated Vedi (fire altars). The entire process was conducted under the guidance of Chief Priest Acharya Satyanarayan, with the support of a team of 54 assistant priests.





Gifts and Farewell: After the wedding ceremony, the newlyweds received essential items and gifts, including gold and silver jewelry, from the Sansthan and the guests. These gifts included mangalsutras, bangles, earrings, ear studs, rings, silver anklets, and other adornments.

Additionally, household items like gas stoves, beds, wardrobes, trunks, utensils, sewing machines, & water tanks were provided to set up their new households. At 2 o'clock in the afternoon, amidst blessings and best wishes, the couples bid farewell in beautifully decorated Doli (palanquins), and the Sansthan's vehicles transported them to their respective cities and villages.

Ramila Lights Up Shaitan's Life...

The light in the eyes of Shaitan Garasia from Abu Road in the district of Sirohi went out suddenly at the age of 6. This brought great sorrow to his parents and four sisters. In 2007, with the help of the villagers, he came to Narayan Seva Sansthan. There, in the residential school of the organization, he began receiving free education and training. Currently, he is a teacher at a private school. A few months ago, he met Ramila, an orphan from Abu. With her consent, Shaitan applied for the free mass wedding organized by Sansthan, which was accepted. At the 40th Mass Wedding, the two have become companions, and Shaitan Garasia is also preparing for his RAS exams.

Ramila says she will be the light in her life partner's eyes, and she will stand by him at every step.


The Struggle of Ankur and Malati

Ankur and Malati have both faced the challenges of living with disabilities since their early years. However, their lives took a significant turn when they founded Narayan Seva Sansthan. Ankur Kumar, hailing from Muzafarnagar, Uttar Pradesh, lost the use of his left leg at the tender age of 2. On the other hand, Malati Kumari, a resident of Lakhi sarai, Bihar, has coped with paralysis in both her legs since birth. Their journeys were laden with obstacles. Ankur had to discontinue his education after the 9th grade, while Malati's schooling only stretched to the 5th grade. Their parents earned their livelihood through labor in brick kilns and farming. In 2014, thanks to the support of the villagers, Malati received treatment at Narayan Seva Sansthan.

She underwent a successful operation on both her legs and received free sewing training, empowering her to become self-sufficient. In 2022, Ankur sought treatment at the sansthanas well. Following a successful surgery, he now walks with the aid of calipers.

Amid their medical journeys, love blossomed, and with the assistance of Sansthan Ankur and Malati tied the knot on the 2nd and 3rd of September.

Vinod and Sita's Inspirational Bond



Polio struck both Vinod Kumar and SitaKhushwa during their childhood. Despite their physical challenges, Vinod, a resident of Firozabad, never lost his determination. With the support of crutches, he faced life's challenges and pursued his education until the 10th grade. While residing in their city, Vinod learned about Narayan SevaSansthan's free projects through the organization's service camp. This led him to Udaipur, where he received three months of free sewing training, becoming self-reliant.

Sita, born with congenital disabilities, suffered from the pain of total disability in her waist and both legs. In Jaipur, during the organization's disability correction camp, they met and pledged to be life partners for life. However, their financial situation was not favorable to success. Then, Vinod found out about the organization's mass wedding program and registered for marriage at the Sansthan. On September 2–3, they became soulmates in a mass wedding ceremony.

Approximately 1000 brothers and sisters benefited.

Deoria

Courtesy of Miraki Foundation, 207 differently-abled people were registered in the camp organized under the chief hospitality of CMO Dr. Rajesh Jha on August 13 at Maharaja AgrasenBhawan in Deoria (Uttar Pradesh). The measurements for creating artificial limbs for 74 individuals and calipers for 64 individuals were taken by Dr. AkhilBhaskar and his team. 10 individuals were selected for free surgery. The event was presided over by the Chairperson of the Miraki Foundation, Mrs. Madhu Agrawal. Sardar City Tour

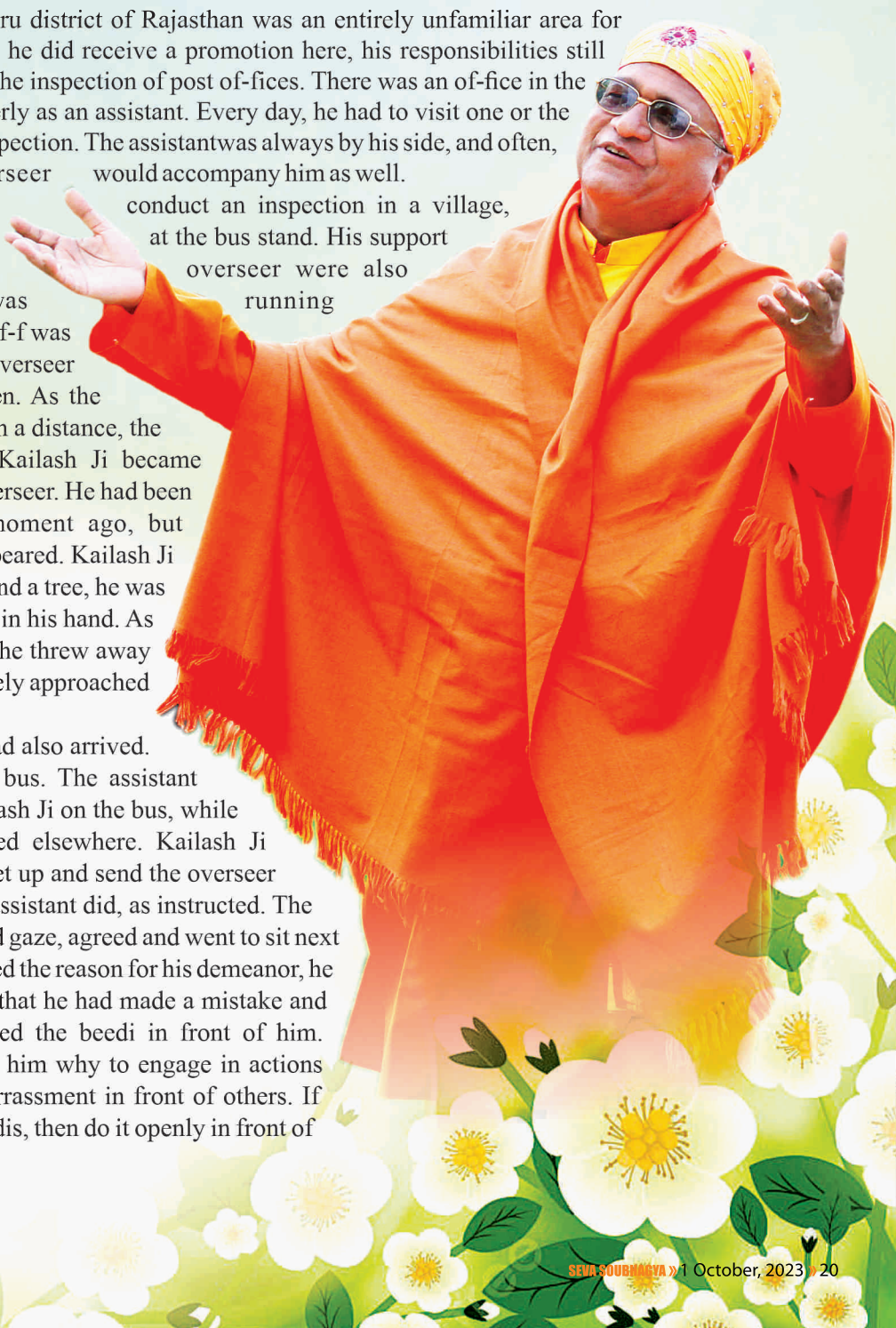
The reverent Guruji Shri Kailash Ji exemplifies a life enriched with service and values, which serves as an invaluable model for society. The life journey of 'Manav' Ji is profoundly and sensitively presented in the book Jhini-JhiniRoshni,' shedding light on his remarkable experiences.

Sardar city of Churu district of Rajasthan was an entirely unfamiliar area for Kailash Ji. While he did receive a promotion here, his responsibilities still revolved around the inspection of post of-fices. There was an of-fice in the house itself and an orderly as an assistant. Every day, he had to visit one or the other post of-fice for inspection. The assistant was always by his side, and often, the area's Male overseer would accompany him as well.

Once, in order to conduct an inspection in a village, Kailash Ji was waiting at the bus stand. His support staf-f (assistant) and overseer were also with him. The bus was running

late, and the support staf-f was sitting nearby, but the overseer was nowhere to be seen. As the bus became visible from a distance, the passengers stood up. Kailash Ji became concerned about the overseer. He had been sitting there just a moment ago, but suddenly, he had disappeared. Kailash Ji looked around and behind a tree, he was spotted. He had a beedi in his hand. As soon as their eyes met, he threw away the beedi and immediately approached Kailash Ji.

By that time, the bus had also arrived. Everyone boarded the bus. The assistant was sitting next to Kailash Ji on the bus, while the overseer was seated elsewhere. Kailash Ji asked the assistant to get up and send the overseer to sit in his place. The assistant did, as instructed. The overseer, with a lowered gaze, agreed and went to sit next to Kailash Ji. When asked the reason for his demeanor, he pleaded in a soft voice that he had made a mistake and should not have smoked the beedi in front of him. Kailash Ji explained to him why to engage in actions that might cause embarrassment in front of others. If you enjoy smoking beedis, then do it openly in front of everyone, why hide it?



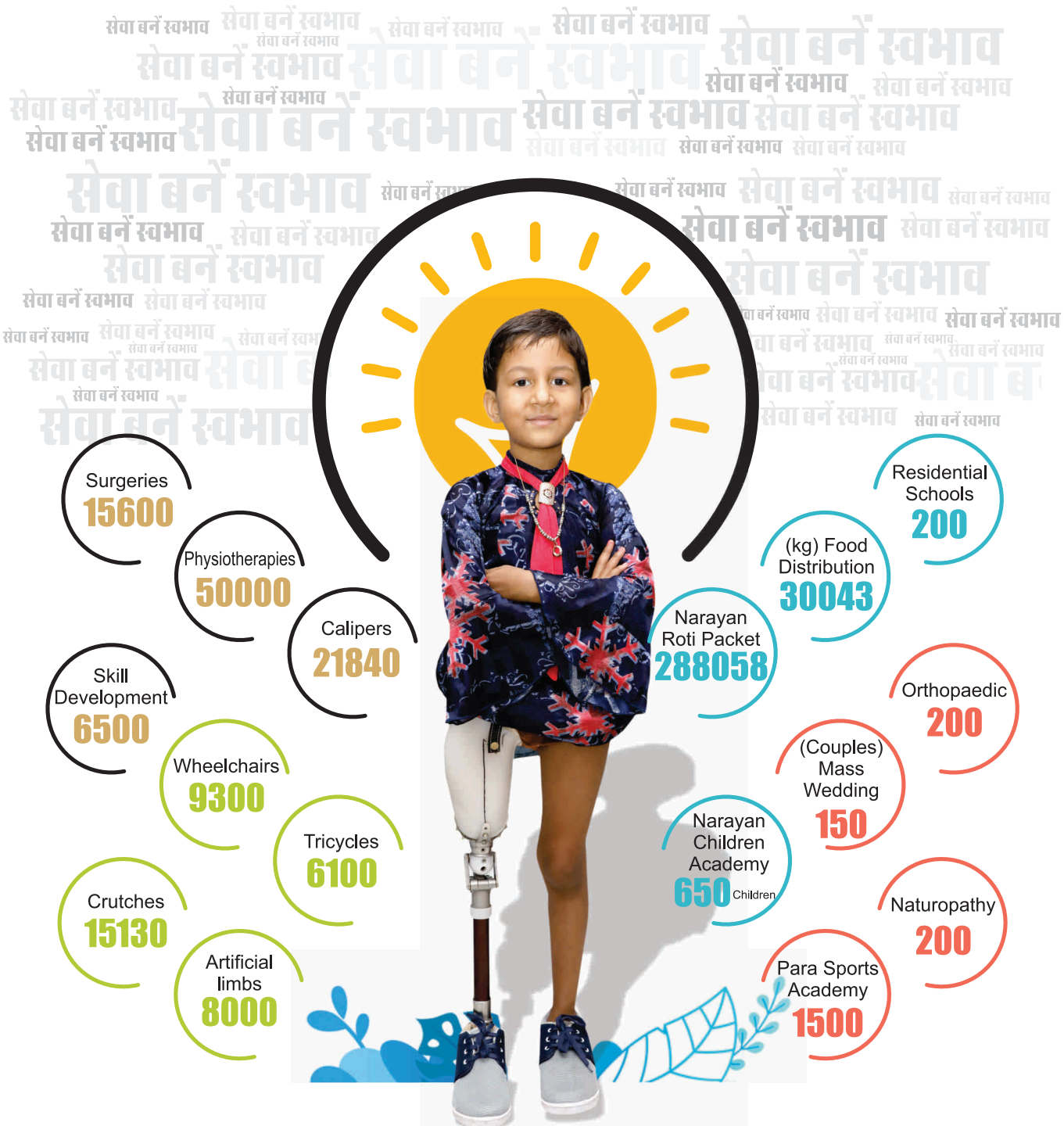
ID cards and belts were given to 350 government school children...

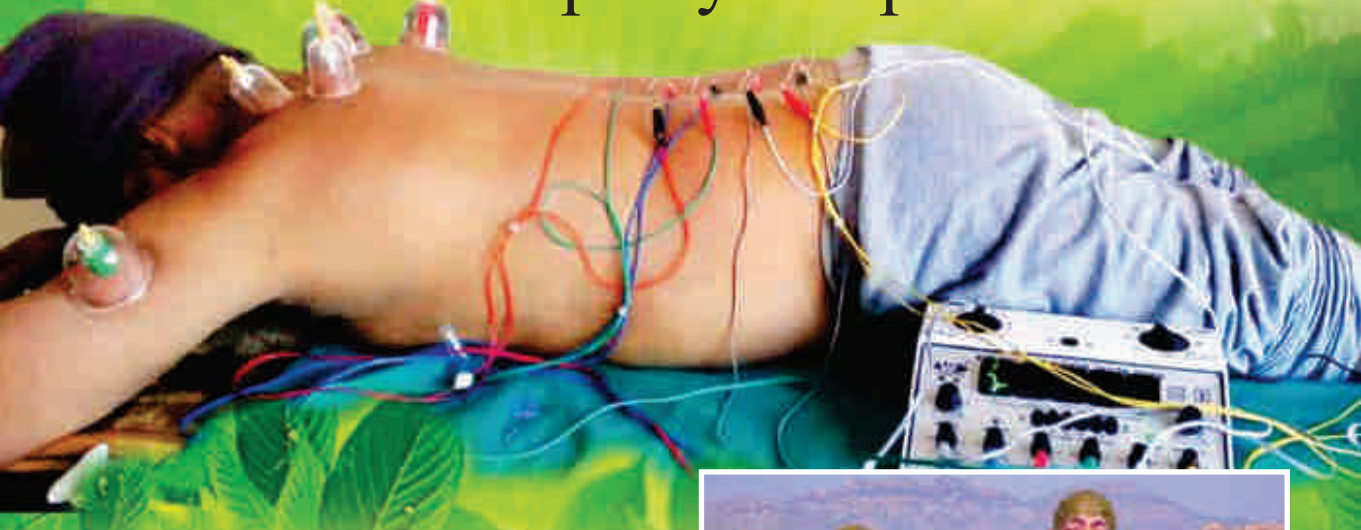
