A Lamp of Joy at the Doorway of Grief...

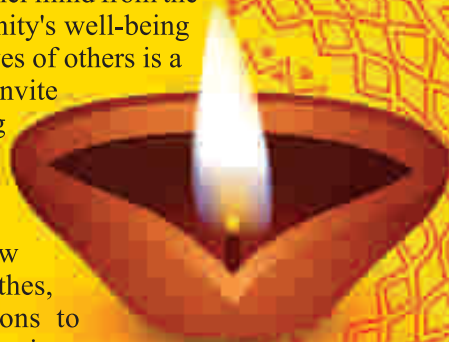

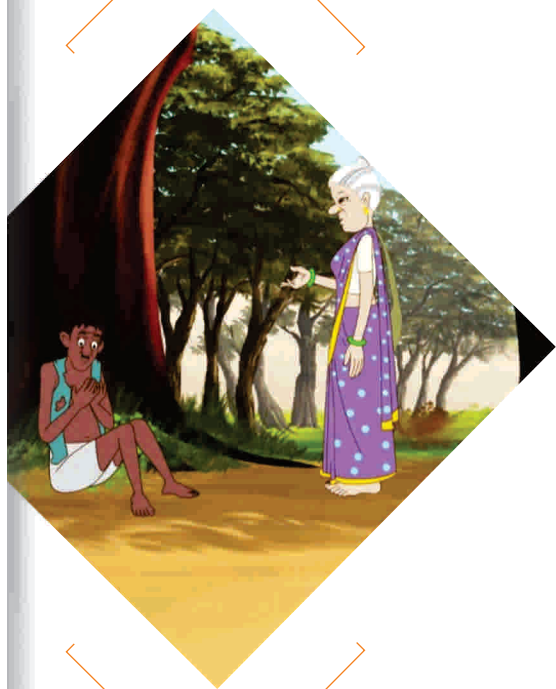


The Significance of Life is in 'Charity'

Sunny Kumar, a resident of Jafarpur, Bihar, set out to fulfill his aspirations in Mumbai. He embarked on a hotel management course, and everything seemed to be on the right track. However, a fateful incident on a local train would forever alter his life. Around eight years ago, while boarding a crowded Mumbai local train, chaos erupted. Sunny fell under the train's wheels, resulting in severe injuries to both his legs. The injuries were so grave that the only way to save his life was to amputate both legs below the knees. For seven long years, Sunny lived with this profound loss, heavily reliant on his parents for support. He struggled to regain independence. However, his life took a turn for the better when he learned about Sansthan and their free artificial limbs program. Sunny made the journey to Udaipur, where he received two prosthetic legs and physiotherapy, allowing him to walk once again. He also acquired computer skills through the Sansthan's free training program, becoming self-reliant. Now, after years of dependence, Sunny is on the path to self-sufficiency, ready to be a pillar of support for his parents.

Defying Physical Challenges, Scoring Success in Cricket...



In the third National Physical Disabilities T20 Cricket Championship held in Udaipur from September 28 to October 8, 2023, Shiva Shankara, a 24-year-old cricketer from Bengaluru, Karnataka, accomplished a remarkable feat. Shiva, a physically challenged athlete, has been actively playing cricket for eight years and is about to complete his journey to 19,000 runs. Shiva initially started his career in sports with tennis ball cricket after losing his right hand in an accident involving a bus when he was just six years old. Inspired by watching his friends play cricket during college, he decided to give it a try. He began his cricket journey by playing alongside the Ranji players and soon moved on to the national level. In the National Physical Disabilities T20 Cricket Championship, he captained the Rest of India team against Jammu and Kashmir. Shiva Shankara has proven that dedication and passion can overcome physical challenges. Today, alongside his job in an IT company, he continues to inspire others with his cricketering achievements.

Divyang Raut, A 15-time National Champion



Born with physical disabilities, GurudasRaut has faced numerous challenges in his life, but he never accepted defeat. Gurudas was born with his left hand only up to the elbow. However, he has become an inspiration to many. Since childhood, Gurudas has had a passion and enthusiasm for cricket, which he pursued vigorously. This 30-year-old all-rounder has made a name for himself not only in India but also internationally. In 2012, when England toured India for a four-match Test series, Gurudas'

performance during a net practice session in Nagpur's VCA Jamtha Stadium earned him considerable fame. He bowled out the legendary Sachin Tendulkar. Following that, Gurudas never looked back. He made it to the 16-member Indian cricket team for the 2019 ICC T20 Cricket World Cup for the Physically Challenged, held in England. Gurudas started his cricket journey with the Maharashtra team in 2006. Despite his physical limitations, he led the Indian cricket team for physically challenged players. Under his leadership, the team performed impressively against countries like South Africa, Pakistan, Afghanistan, Bangladesh, and Sri Lanka. The team has secured the National Championship title 15 times and the Zonal Championship title five times under Gurudas' captaincy. Currently, Gurudas Rout is serving in the maintenance unit of the Indian Air Force at their headquarters in Nagpur. He recently led his team to the semi-finals of the Third National Physical Disability T20 Cricket Championship.

501 Divyang Kanya Poojan

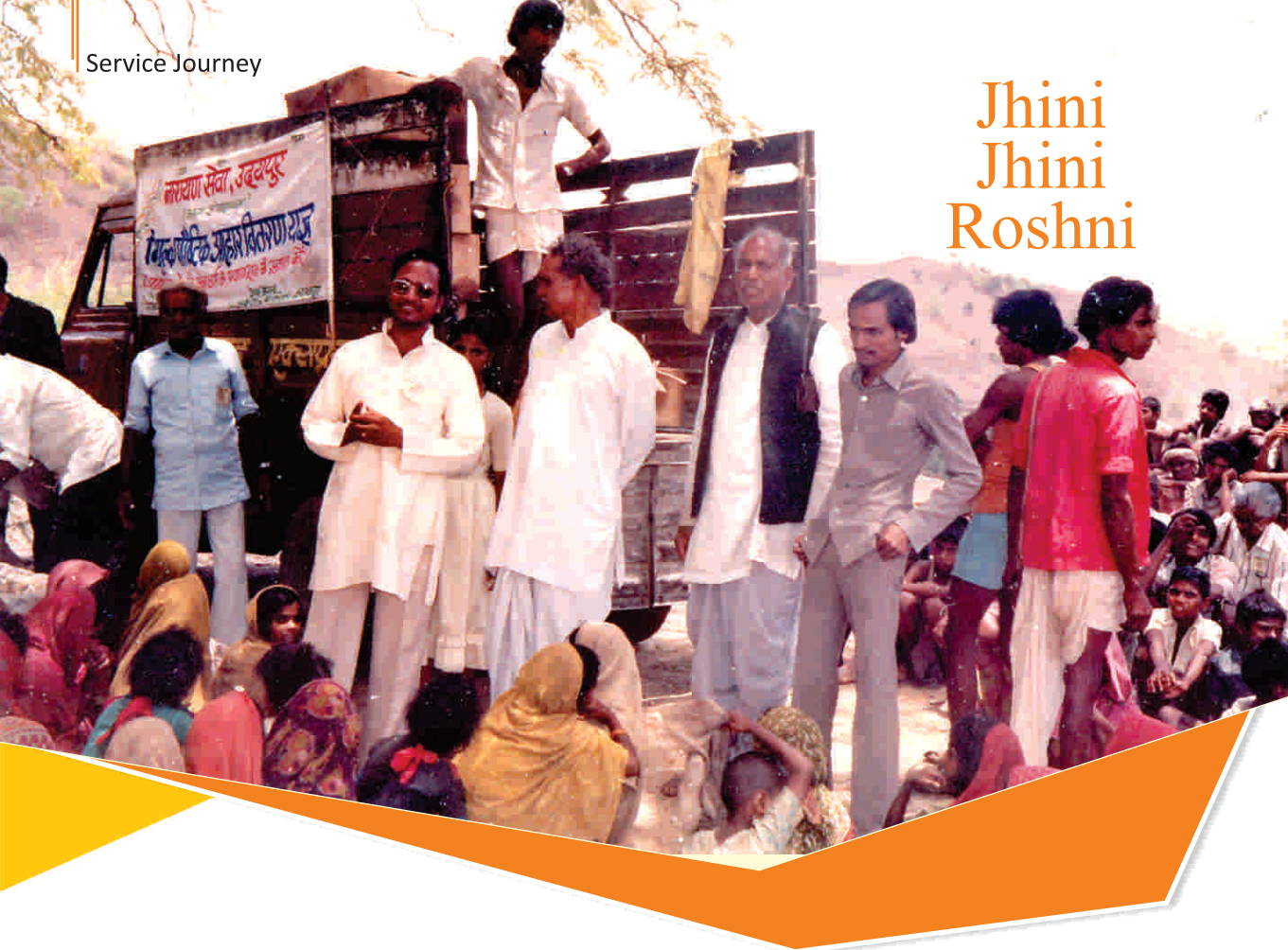

He started wondering whether he had confused the orderly and the overseer, wondering if he hadn't actually instructed the attendant. But the incident

from that day was vividly etched in his memory. He had lifted the attendant from his seat and seated the overseer next to him. Kailash became convinced of his own words. The orderly said, "You had told the overseer, but I was also listening to everything. You were saying it for our good." Manav was very pleased. He imparted a lesson, which was well received. Many people mind their own business and don't interfere in others' matters. But that wasn't his habit. If he felt something, he would express it, and it was because of this that the overseer quit smoking bidi and the orderly had at least begun the process. This incident strengthened Manav's belief in his own principles and actions. Having self-confidence is the first requirement for fulfilling any kind of resolution.
