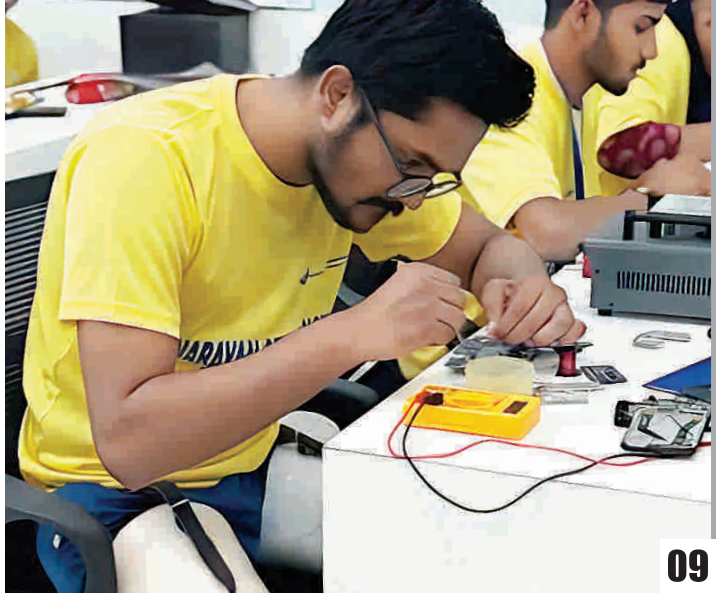

# ANJALI FOUND A NEW LEASE ON LIFE

Kamlesh and Anita Devi, residents of Laduna in the Seetamau tehsil of Mandsaur district, Madhya Pradesh, were delighted with the birth of their daughter. As the daughter grew older, the family adorned her life with numerous dreams. Everything was going well until Anjali turned twelve, when suddenly her health deteriorated. Despite various treatments, relief was elusive. A visit to a major hospital revealed that the daughter was suffering from a condition called 'Hemolytic Blood Disorder,' causing abdominal swelling and a decrease in blood levels in the body. Upon hearing this, the parents were deeply distressed. The doctor recommended immediate surgery, stating that it would incur significant expenses.

However, Kamlesh, earning a livelihood as a hamali (loading and unloading goods on vehicles), was struggling to sustain his family of five members. In such circumstances, arranging for the substantial expenses of the operation seemed impossible. While undergoing treatment at a hospital in Udaipur, he received information about financial assistance for the treatment of complex illnesses from Narayan Seva Sansthan. Kamlesh met the president of the Sansthan, Prashant Agarwal, and briefed him about his financial situation and his daughter's illness. Sansthan immediately extended support for Anjali's operation. As a result, on March 13, her successful operation took place, granting her a new lease on life.

# LAKHDEV LOST ALL FOUR LIMBS, BUT HIS COURAGE REMAINED INTACT



Lakhdev Singh Jadeja, a 35-year-old resident of Rajkot, Gujarat, is a skilled and composed individual by profession, working as a chauffeur. His life has been filled with challenges, with his wife battling cancer, undergoing two surgeries, and the heartbreaking loss of their son to illness 13 years ago.

Around 10 months ago, while hoisting the flag of the goddess on a neem tree, Lakhdev encountered a life-altering incident. A high-voltage current from an 11,000-volt electricity line near the tree severely electrocuted him.

Despite undergoing treatment, he had to amputate all four limbs. Despite the gravity of the situation, Lakhdev maintained a strong spirit, crediting his unshakable faith in the divine. He firmly believes in accepting whatever the Almighty does with a smile.

In December 2023, Lakhdev came across information about the free distribution of artificial limbs and service projects by Narayan Seva Sansthan on social media. He visited the Sansthan in Udaipur, where a team of specialized doctors measured and provided him with artificial limbs for all four limbs. After about four weeks of dedicated practice, he can now stand and walk with the support of artificial limbs.

# SONAKSHI BEGINS WALKING WITH THE GIFT OF ARTIFICIAL LEGS



Sonakshi Singh (14), residing in Rehla, Palamu district, Jharkhand, faced a severe injury in a train accident in 2021, resulting in the amputation of her right leg. During treatment, her family spent 80,000 rupees to get her an artificial limb, but the challenges persisted due to weight fluctuations and the changing needs with growing age. Financial constraints made it difficult for her parents to bear the recurring expenses. On August 6, 2023, they learned about Narayan Seva Sansthan's free artificial limb measurement camp in Rehla. This brought joy to Sonakshi and a gleam of happiness to her face. The measurement was taken, and on October 1, in the distribution camp, a free artificial limb was provided. Sonakshi was elated upon wearing the prosthetic limb. Now, with the help of the artificial limb, she can stand on her feet and walk comfortably.

Sonakshi's parents express their gratitude, emphasizing that the Sansthan not only provided their daughter with a free artificial limb but also became a support for the entire family. They won't forget this gift throughout their lives and extend their heartfelt thanks to the Sansthan.





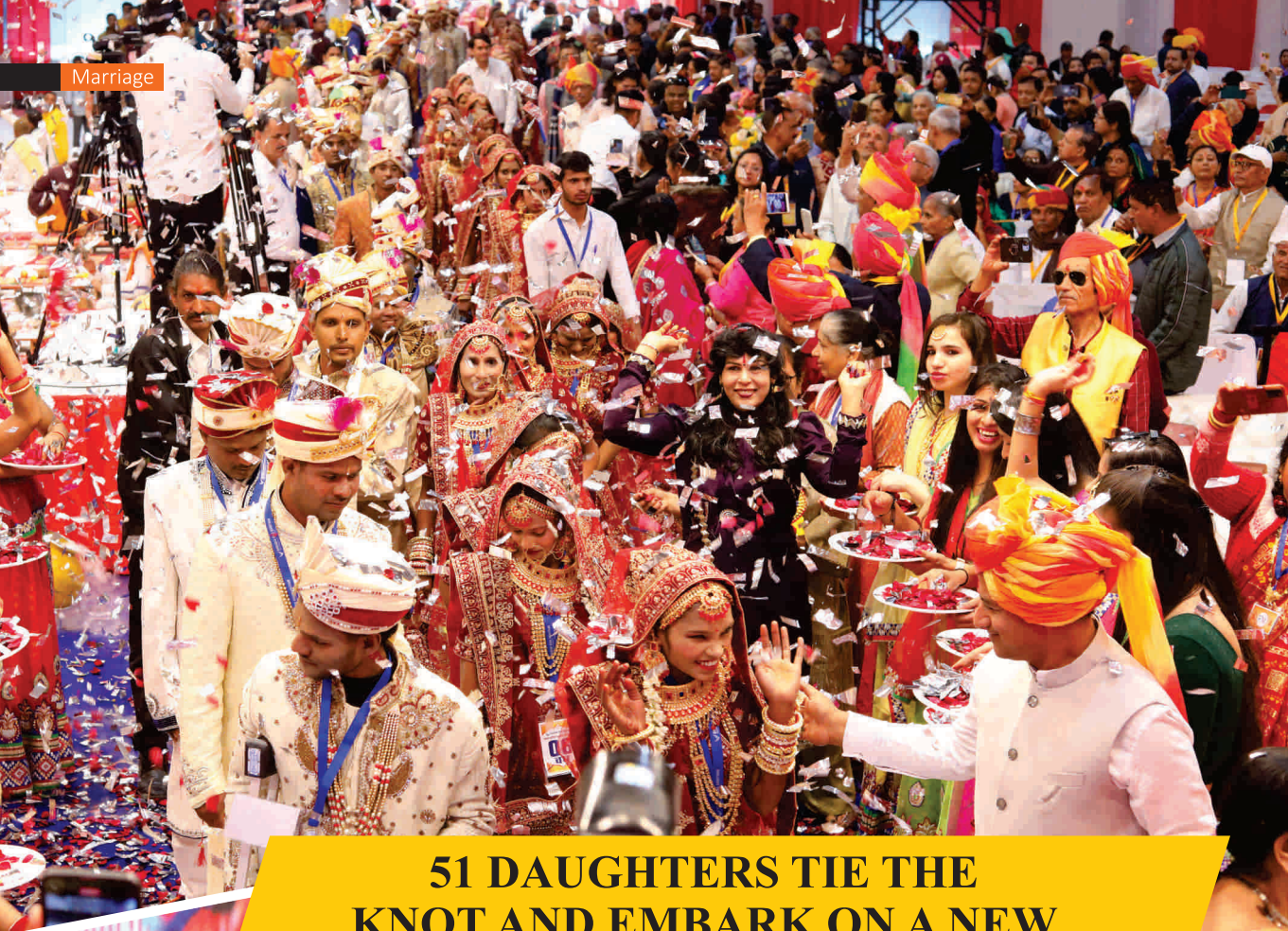
## HARSHAL REJOICES UPON RECEIVING ARTIFICIAL LIMBS

After losing both legs in a train accident, Harshal Kadam's life turned desolate. His dreams were shattered. The incident occurred on October 30, 2021, when he was boarding a train, and a speeding train passing on the adjacent track took him by surprise. Bystanders at the scene rushed him to the hospital. Due to severe damage to both legs, doctors advised amputating both legs. The incident cast a shadow of mourning over his home. Everyone was in a state of deep sorrow. Some months after returning home from the hospital, a friend from Rajasthan told him about Narayan Seva Sansthan, dedicated to the service of the suffering humanity, which provides free artificial limbs to differently-abled individuals, offering them a new life. Harshal contacted the Sansthan and visited Udaipur in May 2023 with his family.



Here, the specialized orthotic and prosthetic team examined and measured both amputated legs. Custom Narayan Limbs were prepared for both legs and provided to him. He was also trained to walk with the artificial limbs for a few days. Now, with the support of artificial limbs, Harshal has started walking easily.

After the treatment, he stayed at the Sansthan and received free mobile repairing training. He expresses his happiness about coming here and gaining new skills. Life sometimes introduces us to new opportunities even after unfortunate incidents. For this, we should always be prepared to move forward positively. Sansthan has not only enabled me to stand on my feet again but has also given me a self-reliant life. Grateful for that!

### 41st Differently-abled Mass Marriage Ceremony of the Sansthan

Among them, 25 couples were normal, while 26 couples were differently-abled, some unable to see, walk without support, or face other challenges. Most of the brides and grooms underwent free corrective surgeries at the Sansthan and received artificial limbs and vocational training, fostering self-reliance. The event witnessed distinguished guests, including Mr. Sohan, Mrs. Mukta Chadha from America, Mr. Bharatbhai Solanki from England, Mrs. Kusum Gupta from Delhi, Mr. Kunwar Bhai from Mombasa, Mr. Gopal Khaitan from Mumbai, and Mr. Anand Parataniya from Odisha. The presence of a large number of guests from across the country added emotional and memorable moments to the 'Seva Mahatirth' premises in the beautifully decorated 'Hada Sabhaghar,' where relatives, friends, donors, and well-wishers celebrated the bonds of love on the occasion of this special mass marriage ceremony.

# 650 DIFFERENTLY-ABLED INDIVIDUALS BENEFITED IN DAR ES SALAAM, NAIROBI AND MERU



Sansthan arranged the Africa Service Tour 2023 from April 11 to 23 with the spirit of "Sarve Bhavantu Sukhinah" (May all be happy). During this tour, three Differently-abled Service Camps were organized in Dar-es-Salaam (Tanzania), Meru, and Kenya. With the support of local social service volunteers, Sansthan conducted an Artificial Limb Distribution Camp in Dar-es-Salaam, where 201 differently-abled individuals affected by accidents were fitted with artificial hands, legs, and calipers. Similarly, in Meru and Kenya, the Modular Artificial Limb Measurement Camp measured 156 and 302 differently-abled individuals, respectively, for artificial limbs. These individuals will receive their artificial limbs in the upcoming camps. Sansthan's ten-member team provided services during these camps, including Rohit Tiwari, Tarun Nagda, Mahim Jain, and Anil Paliwal. The government officials of Africa participating in the camps appreciated the Sansthan's services. Sansthan has been providing assistance to differently-abled individuals in Africa by organizing camps every year. The coordinators of the camps were Mr. Bharat Bhai Parmar and Mr. Ravi Kavadia.





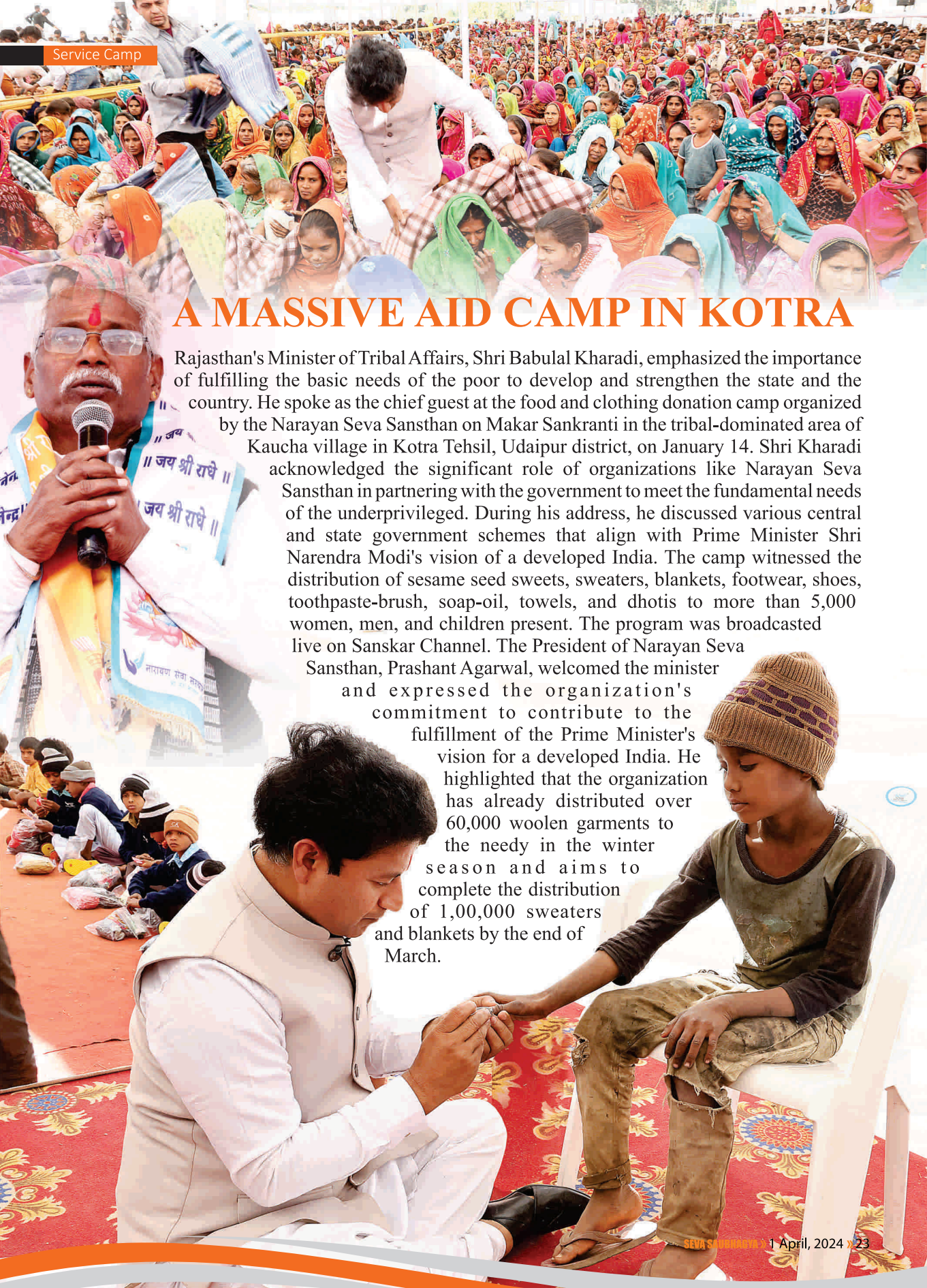
# MEGA ARTIFICIAL LIMB CAMP IN KENYA



In January, inspired by the spirit of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam,' Narayan Seva Sansthan organized five camps in Kenya, South Africa. These camps provided assistance to 1363 differently-abled individuals affected by accidents. In Nairobi, 127 individuals, 85 in Kisii, 133 in Meru, and 257 in Mombasa received modular artificial limbs. Additionally, approximately 800 individuals underwent the process of measurement to create artificial limbs. The camp in Kisumu had Dr. Ida Odinga, the wife of Kenya's former Prime Minister, as the chief guest. The successful execution of these camps was made possible with the support of Lord Mahavir Swami Followers, Pride Enterprises Limited, the family of Late Shri Javerchand Ramji Gudka, Visa Oshwal Community, Hindu Society Meru, and Mombasa Cement. Sansthan's 15-member technical and medical team provided services, and Mr. Suryakant Challa, the Coordinator of Narayan Seva Kenya Chapter, served as the coordinator for all the camps. Sansthan has been organizing such camps in Kenya for the past three years, benefiting more than 1500 differently-abled individuals across 12 camps.

## A MASSIVE AID CAMP IN KOTRA

Rajasthan's Minister of Tribal Affairs, Shri Babulal Kharadi, emphasized the importance of fulfilling the basic needs of the poor to develop and strengthen the state and the country. He spoke as the chief guest at the food and clothing donation camp organized by the Narayan Seva Sansthan on Makar Sankranti in the tribal-dominated area of Kaucha village in Kotra Tehsil, Udaipur district, on January 14. Shri Kharadi acknowledged the significant role of organizations like Narayan Seva Sansthan in partnering with the government to meet the fundamental needs of the underprivileged. During his address, he discussed various central and state government schemes that align with Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's vision of a developed India. The camp witnessed the distribution of sesame seed sweets, sweaters, blankets, footwear, shoes, toothpaste-brush, soap-oil, towels, and dhotis to more than 5,000 women, men, and children present. The program was broadcasted live on Sanskar Channel. The President of Narayan Seva Sansthan, Prashant Agarwal, welcomed the minister and expressed the organization's commitment to contribute to the fulfillment of the Prime Minister's vision for a developed India. He highlighted that the organization has already distributed over 60,000 woolen garments to the needy in the winter season and aims to complete the distribution of 1,00,000 sweaters and blankets by the end of March.



## ARTIFICIAL LIMBS MAKE LIFE EASIER FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES

The organization, with a vision to empower the lives of brothers and sisters who had become disheartened due to accidents causing the loss of limbs, organized camps in 13 cities across the country on January 2024. Through these camps, more than 1500 differently-abled individuals were provided a well-defined path to regain momentum in life using state-of-the-art artificial limbs.

**Rajkot:** On January 7, a camp organized by the Taraben Kishorbhai Doshi Foundation, Rajkot, in collaboration with the Lohana Community Hall in Karanpur, measured and selected 42 individuals for artificial limbs and 35 for calipers. A total of 108 differently-abled individuals were registered during the camp, with 6 candidates selected for corrective surgeries to enhance their abilities. The chief guest for the event was social worker Shri Neeraj Bhai Doshi. The event was presided over by Shri Prakash Bhai Kalola, with special guests including Shri Rajiv Doshi, Shrenik Doshi, Utsav Doshi, Pranjali Doshi, and Tanya Ji. Welcoming the guests, trustee and director of the Sansthan, Shri Devendra Ji Chaubisa and camp in-charge Mukesh Sharma, presented them with traditional attire (Paag-Uparna). The proceedings were led by Shri Aishwary Trivedi, and the vote of thanks was given by Shri Tarun Nagda, the head of Rajkot Ashram.

**Fazilka:** On January 7, the Shri Lakshmi Narayan Gau Seva Trust organized a "Differently-abled Diagnosis, Operation Selection, and Artificial Limb Measurement Camp" at the Ramakrishna Gau Shala in Bajidpur, Fazilka, Punjab. A total of 40 differently-abled individuals were selected during the camp.

**Bilari:** On January 7, a camp was organized at Dr. Devendrapal Saraswati Vidya Mandir in Bilari, Uttar Pradesh, where registration for 172 differently-abled individuals took place. Among them, 98 received calipers, and 74 received artificial limbs. The chief guest was former MLC member Parmeshwar Saini.
