THE GLORY OF THE VIRTUE OF CHARITY

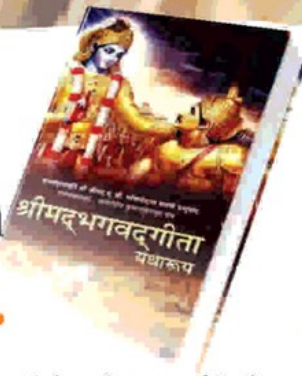
The reward received for giving charity is greater than the feeling with which it is given. This is why the scriptures have advised a person to donate according to his capacity and live a life with spiritual peace.

On the same road, he saw a weak man walking with bare feet. He would take deep breaths again and again, sometimes he would start running, and the next moment he would stop due to his weakness. The poet's tender heart could not see him in this condition, today he too was on foot. He did not use the state's means like palanquin, horse, elephant etc. for his personal work. When he went to that man, he saw that his feet had blisters, and he had not even got anything to eat during the long journey. The court poet immediately took off his shoes and made him wear them and also gave him sattu (a type of flour dough) kept in his bag to eat. The royal poet was also not used to walking barefoot. Delicate feet and hot ground- he felt that he would faint on the way. He had blisters on his feet, but he was happy that he could serve a poor person. His feet were burning, yet he kept walking. At the same time, the mahout was passing by on this road with the royal elephant. When his eyes fell on the royal poet, he immediately took the elephant towards him. When he insisted him to sit on the back of the elephant, he sat down.

Coincidentally, King Bhoj also went out on his elephant in the same hot afternoon to inspect the city administration. Both of them met on the way. The king jokingly asked- Poet sir, from where did you get this elephant? The poet said, O king, I donated my worn out shoes and it is due to that virtue that I am riding an elephant. The king understood the meaning of his statement that the poet is making it clear that the wealth which is not donated is like being wasted and destroyed. The generous king immediately gifted that elephant to the poet and further increased the pace of public welfare works in the state.

Dev Bagdi is 9 years old. This child living in Indore (MP) had dreams of going to school, getting higher education, playing, having fun with friends. But an accident shattered his dreams in a moment. Two and a half years ago, Dev was going with his maternal uncle, maternal aunt and sister. Then he became a victim of a road accident. Aunty died on the spot due to a collision with a truck. Uncle's leg was broken and sister was seriously injured. Dev's left leg was amputated. Due to which it became difficult for him to walk. On 2 June, his measurements were taken in a camp of the institute for fitting a free Narayana prosthetic leg. After three months, he got the Narayana limb on 15 September. With the help of which he can now walk easily. He goes to school and is able to focus completely on fulfilling his dreams. He says that he wants to become a doctor and serve the people.





PARADE AFTER THE FITTING OF ARTIFICIAL LIMBS FOR DIFFERENTLY-ABLED INDIVIDUALS

PROVEN EXCELLENCE IN BADMINTON AS WELL AS IN FOOTBALL.



On November 10th, a fitting camp for artificial limbs was successfully held at Sartaaj Palace, located on Ferozepur Road in Dhyana. Over 467 differently-abled individuals from Punjab were provided with upper and lower artificial limbs and calipers. The participants also received training from expert doctors on the usage and maintenance of the artificial devices. After receiving their artificial limbs, the differently-abled individuals participated in a parade and played football and badminton. The JRS Eastman Group contributed to organizing this camp as part of their social responsibility efforts. The event was graced by the presence of Mr. ShivdularDhillon, Secretary of the Punjab Red Cross Society, as the chief guest. On this occasion, the institution's president, Sevak Prashant Bhaiya, expressed



that on July 21st, in Ludhiana, Over 500 patients attended the camp, out of which 467 differently-abled individuals were selected for artificial limb fittings. As a result, these individuals have now regained momentum in their lives. The institution's trustee-director, Mr. Devendra Chaibisa, shared that during the camp, 263 lower limbs, 46 upper limbs, 20 multiple artificial limbs, and 138 calipers were fitted.

A team of 80 volunteers from the institution provided their services at the camp. The event was graced by the presence of notable dignitaries, including Mr. Jagdish Ji Singhal, owner of the JRS Group, Mrs. Rashi Ji Agarwal, State Vice President of BJP Women's Wing, industrialist and social worker Mr. Anil Ji Gupta, Mr. Shri Pal Ji Jain, Dr. Vivek Ji Garg from Kaithal, Dr. Vikas Ji Makkar, social worker Mr. Harpal Singh Ji, and Mr. Mohar Singh Ji, President of All India Marwari Youth Forum. IN AGRA, 415 DIFFERENTLY-ABLED INDIVIDUALS WILL RECEIVE ARTIFICIAL LIMBS.

A TOTAL OF 120 FREE SURGERIES WILL BE CONDUCTED.

On November 17, a free operation, screening, and Narayan Limb & Calipers measurement camp was organized at the Gurdwara, Sikandra, Agra. The camp was inaugurated by the chief guest, international storyteller and head of Bala ji Dham, Shri Arvind Ji Maharaj. The distinguished guests included social workers Shri Narendrapal Singh, Smt. Asha Singh, and Shri Suresh Agarwal.

The chief guest emphasized the significant contribution of the organization in the fields of disability surgeries, women empowerment, and humanity. He highlighted that this effort will fulfill the vision of creating a healthy and empowered society. Dr. Parth Baghel, the representative of Union Minister SP Singh Baghel, chaired the camp. He stated that only by empowering differently-abled individuals



physically, socially, economically, and intellectually, society can truly progress. The goal of bringing differently-abled individuals into the mainstream is being realized by Narayan SevaSansthan.

The institute's director, Smt. Vandana Ji Agarwal, extended a warm welcome to the distinguished guests in the traditional manner of Mewar's glorious heritage. She shared that this camp benefitted differently-abled individuals from Mathura, Firozabad, Mainpuri, Tashganj, Aligarh, Hathras, and the districts of Dholpur and Bharatpur in Rajasthan.

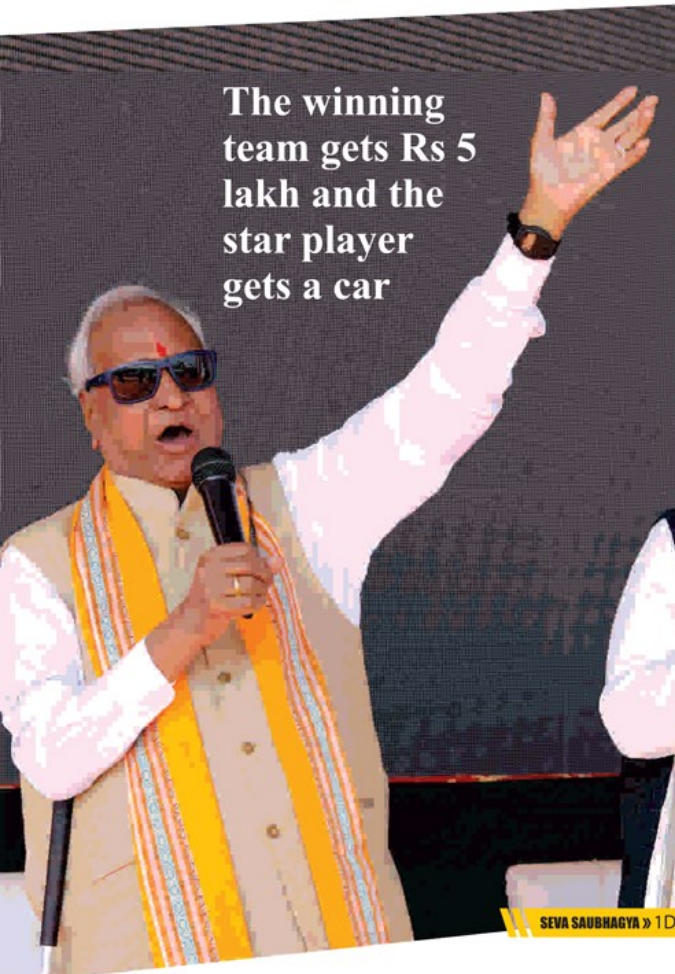
Presenting the camp report, Trustee-Director Shri DevendraChaibisa mentioned that more than 730 differently-abled individuals attended the camp. The institute's doctor and P&O team took measurements for 209 individuals to fit Narayan limbs (arms and legs) and for 205 individuals to fit calipers. Around 120 individuals were selected for free surgeries, which will take place at the institute's hospital in Udaipur. After about 2-3 months, another camp will be organized in Agra to fit artificial limbs. The camp's organization was supported by the municipal corporation, the Sensitivity Team, Robin Hood Army, Shri Krishna Jan Kalyan, EkPehal, and the World Peace Human Society. The event was coordinated by Mahim Jain, and the vote of thanks was delivered by Hari Prasad Laddha.

O We have lost some of our body parts in the accident but the zeal and passion to fight life is still there. We will try our best to give our best. With this spirit, the tournament started on 15th October at Udaipur Field Club ground. The 4th National Physical Disability T-20 Cricket Championship concluded on 25th October with prize distribution at BN College ground. The 11-day long championship was organized under the aegis of Narayan SevaSansthan in collaboration with Differently Aabled Cricket Council of India (DCCI). This was the first time when the best player of the tournament got a shiny car. Inauguration Ceremony: - Chief Guest MP Dr. MannalalRawat and Mona Agarwal, bronze medalist in shooting at Paris Paralympics-2024, were saluted by more than 400 players and their coaches from 24 teams of different states of the country by marching past during the flag hoisting. This event was organized under the holy presence of the institute founder PujyaGurudev Shri Kailash Ji 'Manav'.

Special guests of Cricket Championship were PCCI President Mr. SurendraLohia, DCCI State President Mrs. Jyotsna Chaudhary, Officer Corporate Chairman DCCI Mr. Rajesh

He told that the Sansthan has successfully organized two National Para Swimming, one National Blind Cricket, one National Wheelchair Cricket Championship and Third National Disabled Cricket Championship in the past. Organizing the Wheelchair Cricket Championship has also been recorded in the Guinness Book of World Records. Welcoming on behalf of DCCI, Secretary Shri Ravikant Chauhan told that the players participating in the championship are above 18 years of age. Most of the players are suffering from physical disability due to loss of one hand or one leg or due to congenital disability. of Bengal, Asit Jaiswal of Gujarat, Wasim Iqbal of Jammu and Kashmir and Amir Khan also participated in this championship. They have also been a part of Para World Cup Tournament. Closing:- National Divyang Cricket Championship concluded on 25th October with the Mumbai team winning the trophy in the final match at BN College ground with the blessings of the institute founder Pujya Shri Kailash Ji 'Manav'. The chief guest was Rajya Sabha member Chunnihal Garasiya. Chairman of Khatu Shyam Mandir Management Committee and Patron of DCCI Maharaj Shri Pratap Singh presided over the function. In the beginning, welcoming the guests on behalf of the institute, the institute's president Sevak Prashant Bhaiya Ji said that this dedication of the disabled towards sports is praiseworthy. The institute is fortunate to be a part of this Maha Kumbh of disabled cricket. DCCI Secretary Mr. Ravikant Chauhan presented the tournament report. As special guests, DCCI Rajasthan President Mrs. Jyotsna Chaudhary, Dronacharya Awardee Mr. Mahavir Saini, Rajasthan Royals Head Staff Mr. Abhijeet, former captain of Rajasthan Ranji team Mr. Rohit Jhalani, DCCI Joint Secretary Mr. Abhay Pratap Singh, DCCI Corporate Affairs Committee Chairman Mr. Rajesh Bhardwaj, Chaturbhuj Foundation's Mr. Rahul Patel and the Foundation's representative Mr. Bhupendra Kumar were present. The event was conducted by Mr. Mahim Jain.

Awards:In the presence of 24 teams' players and hundreds of spectators, the Man of the Match award in the final went to Ravindra Sante from Mumbai, who was awarded 11,000. The Best Bowler of the tournament, Satish Kirad from Rajasthan, received 25,000, while the Best Fielder from Maharashtra, Kunal Phanse, also received 25,000. The Best Batsman, Shiva shankara from Karnataka, was awarded 25,000. These prizes were given by Sminu Jindal on behalf of Narayan Seva Sansthan.

The Player of the Series, Akash Patil from Mumbai, received a scooter, and Surendra Khorwal, the Star



Player of the Tournament from Rajasthan, was presented with the key to a shiny car. These gifts were provided by Shri Chaturbhuj Foundation.

The teams from Rajasthan and Maharashtra, who reached the semifinals, were each awarded 1 lakh. The winners, Mumbai, received 5 lacs, while the runners-up, Karnataka, were awarded 2.5 lacs.

Mumbai Claims the Trophy:

In the final, Karnataka won the toss and opted to bat. With Narendra Mangore scoring an excellent 68 runs, Karnataka set a target of 175 runs for 6 wickets. In response, Mumbai chased down the target easily, scoring 178 runs for 2 wickets in just 18.1 overs, thanks to contributions from Ravindra Sante (70 runs) and Prasad Chaudhan (57 runs), winning by 8 wickets and claiming the trophy.

He then began practicing on the grounds of Meerut. His remarkable cover drive and straight drive with one hand are truly a sight to behold. His unique way of holding the bat is a clear testament to his skills as a talented batsman.

Pramod considers Indian cricket team captain Rohit Sharma as his idol. He receives immense support from his family in pursuing his passion. Recently, during the 4th National T-20 Disabled Cricket Tournament held at Narayan SevaSansthan, he displayed outstanding batting by scoring a century with the help of 14 boundaries off just 72 balls. This incredible knock helped Delhi put up an impressive total of 183 runs.

If Kailash Ji could not attend the Sattu distribution camps in Bilaspur, he would go to the Ramayan Mandal. The joy he experienced while serving patients at the Sirohi hospital was now fulfilled by serving at the Udaipur hospital. During those days, Dr. R.K. Agarwal had been transferred to Udaipur, and due to his service-oriented nature, he had quickly gained a good reputation. Kailash Ji had already known him from Bhilwara.

The telephone office had a lunch break between 1 and 2 PM. Kailash Ji began using this time to serve patients at the hospital. He would arrive at the hospital with fruits, biscuits, and books in a bag. Dr. Agarwal had assigned him a locker where he could keep his bag and other items. Dr. Agarwal had an orthopedic ward, and Kailash Ji began spending more time there.

Seeing Kailash Ji coming and going in the hospital without any restrictions raised some eyebrows. One particular employee did not like Kailash Ji's regular visits to the hospital. He would constantly complain, saying that Kailash Ji walked in with an attitude, as if the hospital were his personal property. Kailash Ji tried to explain himself, but the criticism continued.

One day, the famous freedom fighter, Constituent Assembly member, and former MP, Master Balwant Singh Mehta, came to the hospital to meet someone. He saw Kailash Ji serving the patients and was deeply impressed. Although Kailash Ji didn't know him personally, he had heard his name. Master Mehta invited Kailash Ji to his house and inquired more about him. When Kailash Ji realized that it was Master Balwant Singh, he was overjoyed and immediately bowed down at his feet. After some general conversation, Kailash Ji mentioned that he participated in the Ramayan Mandal's programs. Master Mehta replied that he also hosted satsangs at his house every Saturday, and Kailash Ji was welcome to join.

Kailash Ji was always on the lookout for such opportunities. One Saturday, he went to the satsang at Master Balwant Singh Mehta's house. There, he had the privilege of meeting prominent figures from Mewar, such as Dr. Daulat Singh Kothari, Justice Ranawat, and Colonel Bakhtawar Singh, whose names were well-known throughout the country. Having heard so much about them, Kailash Ji was overwhelmed and immediately fell at their feet.

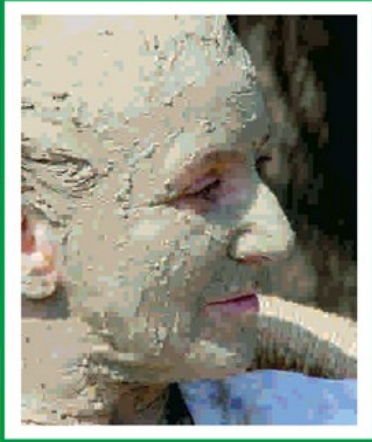
